

Dear Emory Alumni and Friends,


We invite you to join our *Journey to Greece*, which will explore several of this ancient land's most magnificent places, including storied Athens, the Peloponnese, and the islands of Hydra and Crete. We will visit ancient sites and picturesque towns and villages, learn about their remarkable history, witness contemporary culture, and savor distinctive Greek cuisine. October is one of the best months of the year to visit Greece. The summer crowds are gone and the weather is ideal for touring.

Among the highlights are the incomparable monuments of Athens, which date from the 5th century BC, the city's Golden Age; the fabled citadel of Mycenae; the spectacular ancient theater of Epidaurus; the evocative seaside old town of Nafplion; the iconic island Hydra; and fabulous Crete, the largest Greek island, which was home to Europe's first civilization. We will encounter a broad range of architecture, from the ruins of the prehistoric era to Classical, Byzantine and Medieval structures to the clean lines of contemporary Greek residences, and survey rugged landscapes' that produce some of the world's best olive oil, fine wines and other artisanal products. And we will dine in a variety of charming venues featuring local cuisine.

We hope you will join us on this special tour of Greece, which was custom-designed for Emory travelers.

Saturday, October 11, 2025 **DEPART THE US**

Depart the US for Athens, Greece.

Sunday, October 12

ATHENS, Greece

Arrive in Athens and transfer to the *Hotel Elia*, which is conveniently located in the center of the city and near its many attractions and shopping areas. In the evening, enjoy a welcome dinner at a local restaurant. (D)

Monday, October 13 ANCIENT SITES AND ATTRACTIVE NAFPLION

Leave the hotel in the morning for the northern region of the Peloponnese, renowned for its wealth of ancient sites and old picturesque towns. Visit Mycenae, the most important and powerful center in the Greek mainland that flourished during the Bronze Age, and the stronghold of Agamemnon, who led the Greeks against Troy. Continue to seaside Nafplion, one of Greece's most attractive old towns, where lunch will be served at a local restaurant. In the afternoon, explore Epidaurus, famed for its magnificent 4th-century BC theater, before returning to the hotel. (B, L)

Tuesday, October 14 THE ATHENIAN ACROPOLIS

In the morning, tour the Acropolis and its celebrated monuments, including the incomparable Parthenon, the temple dedicated to the goddess Athena. Built in the 5th century BC, the monuments present the zenith of architecture and art of the Classical period. Also visit the Acropolis Museum, which houses an outstanding collection of sculptures. Spend the afternoon at leisure to explore Athens on your own. (B)

Wednesday, October 15 THE ISLAND OF HYDRA

Sail in the morning to Hydra, one of the most striking and photogenic islands of Greece. As the boat arrives, admire the island's only town that is hidden in a deep gap of slopes, filled with imposing stone mansions that rise amphitheatrically from the harbor to the top of the rock that were built in the 17th and 18th centuries. Hydra is the only Greek island with a total ban on automobile traffic. Explore the architectural treasures of the town, its old churches, and mansion museums. Enjoy lunch at a local taverna and spend time at leisure before returning to Athens. (B, L)

Thursday, October 16 ATHENS/HERAKLION, Crete

In the morning, transfer to the airport for the flight over the Aegean Sea to Heraklion, the vibrant and dynamic city of Crete. The largest of the Greek islands, Crete is home to Europe's first civilization, the Minoan, which rose about 4,000 years ago. From 1205 to 1669, Crete was a prized possession of Venice. Known for its beautiful landscapes and abundant flora, Crete is also the place that gave birth to the Mediterranean Diet, the cuisine of which we will enjoy



during our stay. After lunch, take a tour that will familiarize you with Heraklion, visiting the beautiful Morosini Fountain, built in 1628, the majestic church of St. Titos, and the Historical Museum of Crete. Spend the next three nights at the *Hotel Galaxy*. (B, L)

Friday, October 17 HERAKLION/RETHYMNO/HERAKLION

In the morning, drive along the scenic coastal road to Rethymno, one of Crete's most enchanting towns, built between its imposing 15th-century fortress and the sea. The town is notable for its characteristic Venetian architecture, its maze of alleyways lined with buildings that reveal the long presence of Venice. Tour the town, including the interesting Archaeological Museum, and the church of St. Spyridon, a Byzantine chapel that is decorated with precious icons. After lunch at a local restaurant, enjoy time at leisure before returning to the hotel. (B, L)

Saturday, October 18 THE MINOAN PALACE OF KNOSSOS


In the morning, tour the palace of Knossos, the largest and most magnificent Minoan palace in Crete. Clustered around a spacious courtyard, the palace contains a maze of rooms, passages and stairways. More than any other Minoan remain, Knossos reveals the brilliance and refinement of the Bronze Age Minoan civilization. Also visit the superlative Archaeological Museum, home to the exquisite Minoan artifacts. Afternoon is at leisure. You may wish to visit the Heraklion Market, an institution of the city. A farewell dinner will be served at a local restaurant. (B, D)

Sunday, October 19 HERAKLION/USA

Transfer to the airport for the return flight home. (B)

GENERAL INFORMATION

PAYMENT SCHEDULE: A deposit of \$1,000 per person is required to reserve your space on the tour. Final payment is due 90 days prior to departure. Payment can be made by personal check or charged to a credit card.

CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS: All cancellations are subject to a \$300 per person administrative fee. Cancellations received 61-90 days prior to departure will be assessed a penalty equal to 50% of the total program cost per person. Cancellations received within 60 days of departure are subject to 100% cancellation penalties. Requests for cancellations must be made in writing. No refunds will be made for any part of this program in which you choose not to participate.

INSURANCE: We strongly recommend the purchase of trip cancellation insurance, which is available for coverage of expenses in conjunction with cancellation due to illness or accident. Baggage insurance is also recommended. In the event that you must cancel your participation in a travel program, trip cancellation insurance may be the only source of reimbursement.
